and the elves all have cocoa and cookies and snacks.

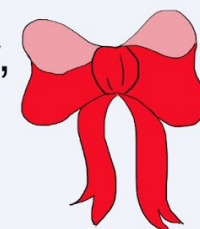


When his table was cleared and the floor was well swept
